Dear MERLOT Community,

Once again, MERLOT wishes the worldwide community of teachers and learners a safe and healthy journey in 2021 as the COVID-19 pandemic continues to create heartbreaking tragedies for so many. We hope the free and open access to online educational resources will help you help others cope with these very challenging circumstances. We continue to provide a [free MERLOT-SkillsCommons OER portal](#) to help people move online with their teaching and learning. As a MERLOT member, you have access to MERLOT Content Builder which enables you to customize this OER portal for your community. MERLOT has supported a number of our partners in this way.

- [Pandemic Professors](#): volunteer tutoring for low-income children to help eliminate the inequities in education accentuated by the pandemic.
- [Women in Sustainable Employment \(WISE\)](#): Women have been affected disproportionately by the pandemic and we are helping provide free and open access to professional development resources. We create a version for the National Skills Development Corporation of India as well.
- [Technical colleges, high schools, and other higher ed institutions](#) making the transition to online education.
- Partnering with the [Texas International Education Consortium](#) to support their middle-east English as a foreign language programs moving online.

The growth of MERLOT in demand and usage has continued. Each month almost 2 million materials are viewed and about 1,000 people register as MERLOT members (about a three fold increase). Even with this significant increase in new members, over 13% of MERLOT members are contributing new resources and expertise to the MERLOT library. KEEP UP THE GOOD WORK! Since the start of the pandemic, the # of downloads of SkillsCommons resources has increased over 40%.

As OER has become a more viable option for course materials, revising the OER to align with local needs become more in demand. MERLOT and SkillsCommons has focused on building partnership with low-cost commercial providers that have easy to use technology platforms that enable people to easily customize OER to meet their specific needs.

Activities with some recent partners include:

- [Odigia](#) provides a competency-based education platform for adopting and customizing OER.
- [SoftChalk](#) provides easy to use tool to take static OER and make it interactive
- [ecoText](#) provides students and teachers ways to customize open textbook

All these activities are informing our major project with Historical Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), supported by the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation. Empowering these institutions with MERLOT's and SkillsCommons' open educational resources, practices, and services is the goal and you can explore our strategies and progress at their Affordable Learning HBCU Community Portal <https://hbcuals.org>.

My final comment is the deep gratitude for all the MERLOT editorial board members, our general members, and the MERLOT staff that have continued to put their hearts, minds, and compassions into continuing their contributions to the community's free and open library. With all your efforts, large and small, the world of learners and teachers have their burdens just a little bit lighter as education helps make the world a better place for all.

The Distinguished Service Award

The Distinguished Service award is reserved as MERLOT's highest honor. The recipient of this award demonstrates the vision that brings MERLOT members together to create the MERLOT community and our services. Recipients of this award have exemplified, through their dedication and leadership, the highest values MERLOT holds. The recipients of this award are selected by the previous winners with consultation from MERLOT management. This year's recipient is our own Barbra Bied Sperling. Barb served as MERLOT's webmaster from 2000 to 2020. She began her tenure at MERLOT as the webmaster and became manager of MERLOT's technology team for many years, ensuring the upgrades, innovations, and expansions of MERLOT technologies were designed and deployed successfully. Barb was instrumental in the many MERLOT updates and improvements over the years including supporting editors and editorial boards and has always been willing to go that extra mile for MERLOT and the team. We celebrate Barb's dedication and expertise with our highest honor and appreciation for her service.

The Institutional Stewardship Award

The Institutional Stewardship award recognizes efforts to promote MERLOT at an institutional level. MERLOT seeks to identify models that can be used to sustain support for MERLOT and demonstrate the value of MERLOT. Recipients of the award are judged by the MERLOT Management team. This year's recipient is [Ohio's Eastern Gateway Community College's Open Library for Education](#). Eastern Gateway has used MERLOT's and Skill Common's resources to promote affordable learning for its students. Since the inception of the initiative, Eastern Gateway students have saved more than \$22 million dollars in textbooks and lab fees in one year. Eastern Gateway has made the commitment to a "Free Education" at the community college level and combined with free tuition, the free access truly enables them to deliver on that promise to their community.

Classics Awards

Four editorial boards selected Classics Award Winners. These materials were deemed to be exemplars in their fields.

The winner of the 2021 MERLOT **Health Sciences Classics Award** "[Transitions to Professional Nursing Practice](#)," was given to Jamie Murphy. The Health Sciences Editorial Board says, "The author covers all the necessary content. It is very important that BSN nurses and above understand the constantly changing landscape of the profession of nursing. The author accomplishes this in a deliberate unfolding of information."

John Green won the **ICT Literacy Award**, for his material, "[Navigating Digital Information](#)." The ICT Literacy Board stated, "The videos are engaging, clear, and concise. John Green accurately provides key concepts and uses current concrete examples to aid understanding - and points out the need to learn how to evaluate online resources."

The **Mathematics** Board awarded John Hammersley for [Overleaf](#). "This site provides a great online LaTeX editor fully free for personal uses, which is very good for many students and independent researchers who cannot afford the high costs of other LaTeX editors," reported the Mathematics Board.

"[PSPP: A Basic Tutorial](#)" was selected by the **Sociology** Board; Ed Nelson and John Korey shared the award. The Board noted, "This tutorial is intended for those who want to learn the basics of PSPP, which is a statistical analysis program available to users at no charge. This tutorial offers clear and concise step-by-step directions on how to use PSPP for a variety of purposes."

MERLOT House Cup

The House Cup (modeled on the Harry Potter House Cup) is an award to recognize the level of contributions made to the MERLOT collection during the past academic year. Contributions include Reviews, Contributions to MERLOT, Assignments, Comments, and editor reviews. The top five editorial boards in alphabetical order were: **Biology, Business, Health Sciences, Mathematics, and Teacher Education**.

This year's winner was the **Health Sciences Board** which made 931 contributions to MERLOT, including 65 individual reviews, and 9 composite reviews. Nancyruth Leibold, a new editor for the Board worked with Board Members Kelly Massey and Colleen Nevins to achieve this award.

New Award - The Rising Star Board

The Rising Star Board was selected from those Boards with between 2 and 4 members and is based on the number of reviews that were produced by that board divided by the number of board members between March 16, 2020 and March 1, 2021. The top small boards included Engineering, Health Sciences, Library, and Psychology. The winner of the Rising Star Award was Health Sciences.

MERLOT created the Peer Reviewer Extraordinaire award to honor the hard work and generous donation of our members' time, energy and enthusiasm that they direct towards the growth and development of MERLOT. The MERLOT-SkillsCommons team, in partnership with Tennessee State University (TSU), has successfully launched a pilot project designed to upskill and support Affordable Learning Solutions (AL\$) within a select group of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs). AL\$ initiatives are saving campuses across the nation millions of dollars - a savings institutions can pass on to students. Generously funded under the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, TSU and their partner and affiliate institutions are building and supporting faculty skills and adopting campus-level protocols to establish sustainable use and reuse of open educational resources.

To ensure project acceleration, the MERLOT- SkillsCommons and TSU project teams are deploying carefully designed strategies with one such instrument being the [MERLOT-SkillsCommons HBCU AL\\$ Community Portal](#). The AL\$ Community Portal offers direct links to OER searches and sharing methodologies, CTE content, Virtual Labs, ePortfolio Showcases, project planning and so much more.

The [MERLOT-SkillsCommons HBCU Affordable Learning Solutions \(AL\\$\) Resource Center](#) is the latest tool created to support faculty and leadership teams. As a customized home for tips, tools, and toys, the Center's design offers campus wide support for strategic HBCU AL\$ initiatives. The rich collection includes archived workshops and video tutorials, OER search and revision methods made easy, workforce development content, and assistance in gaining campus buy-in and building leadership support.



As a Hewlett Foundation pilot project, the intention and design for this effort is to create a model easily scalable to additional HBCUs and other educational systems across the country such as Minority Serving Institutions as well as traditional higher education settings. Hewlett's generous funding is creating long-term usability features, helping to remove access barriers, and is better ensuring success rates for faculty and students. By increasing the likelihood of OER becoming a campus fixture, the project helps institutions build more affordable education and training opportunities and reduce costs for the institution and students alike. Win-Win!

MERLOT Partnership Projects



What started initially as the controversial Stanford Prison Experiment by Dr. Philip Zimbardo in 1971 became a collective social experiment called the [Heroic Imagination Project](#), a nonprofit research and education organization dedicated to training people to act in more heroic ways. For the past decade, HIP has been conducting trainings and workshops for businesses and schools across the United States and many nations around the world. Whether taking on bullying, police oversight, racism, or sexism, HIP has been committed to teaching the skills essential for acting more heroically every day.

MERLOT has been partnering with the HIP since 2014 and together has implemented HIP training in California State University for students, faculty, and staff with very positive results. MERLOT has also expanded its library of free and open educational resources to include HIP resources.



The newest collaborative project is the creation of the [Heroic Imagination in Literature](#) website that provides a series of essays that illuminate the character of mythical and real heroes in literature. This resource can help us all imagine how we can take heroic actions in our everyday lives. The website was built with MERLOT Content Builder and functions as an OER (open educational resource) center for people wanting to include HIP themes and resources into their teaching.





Grape Camp Information

To become a Peer Reviewer for MERLOT, individuals should be an instructor in an institution of higher education and have:

- Expertise in the scholarship of their field
- Excellence in teaching, with a few exceptions
- Experience in using technology in teaching and learning, and
- Connections to professional organizations in their discipline.

MERLOT has developed an orientation for Peer Reviewers to ensure that they become familiar with MERLOT processes and policies on Peer Review. MERLOT Management conducts GRAPE Camp (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) to assist Peer Reviewers on a regular basis. GRAPE Camp consists of a series of three one-hour workshops online, one per week. In these webinars, participants will:

- Develop an understanding of MERLOT
- Learn how MERLOT evaluates Learning Materials
- Conduct a group review
- Complete an Individual Review
- Learn how to use the Workspace tool, and
- Introduce participants to the Editorial Board of their disciplines.





Meet the Editor



World Languages - New Editor, Bertrand Tchoumi

Dr. Bertrand Tchoumi is a New Leaders endorsed school leader and the founding Principal of the Baltimore International Academy (BIA) West, A multilingual immersion school in Baltimore city, Maryland. A former journalist and World Press Institute fellow, he taught French at both secondary and university levels before transitioning to school leadership. Before his current position, he served as Assistant Principal at Monarch Academy Public Charter School and Baltimore International Academy East, Baltimore, Maryland. Bertrand has been a member of MERLOT since 2006.

He holds a Doctorate Degree in Urban Education Leadership from Morgan State University. He wrote a very innovative dissertation titled: *Why do you "talk" like that? The Accented voices of Black African Immigrants in School Leadership*. In addition to narrative inquiry and decolonizing epistemologies, his areas of interest include urban education leadership and bilingual and multilingual learning.

Dr. Tchoumi also earned a Master's in Educational Leadership from Langston State University in the United States; and a bachelor's degree in French Modern Letters and a master's degree in African Literature from the University of Yaoundé I, Cameroon. He has facilitated numerous professional development sessions for the Baltimore City Public School, the Maryland Foreign Language Association (MFLA), and the North East Conference for the Teaching of Foreign Language (NECTFL). In 2013, the French Embassy in the United States awarded him a grant to attend a two weeks training at CAVILAM in Vichy, France. He is also the 2010 winner of the MFLA Escola Teacher Incentive Grant.

Diane Bandow, Associate Editor in Business, has two publications out in May.



James Marion, another member of the Information Technology Board was recently awarded the PMI Risk Management Professional Certification - March 2021. Jim is author of two new publications:


