

Transcript of Pear Deck Tutorial- Video

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SPEAKER: Hi everyone, my name is Fariah Hyatali and I will be presenting an introduction to Pear Deck.

It's a basic tutorial on how to create a Pear Deck presentation.

This is an Instructor's guide to using Pear Deck and I know you are going to have a lot of fun creating your very own interactive slides.

So today's objective is to create a Pear Deck presentation that would promote student engagement.

Now, for your benefit my learners, I have decided to incorporate snapshots of the Pear Deck extension because it's already downloaded on my browser.

So you can begin by opening Google Slides.

Today we are looking at downloading the Pear Deck extension via Google Slides.

However, it can be done using Office 365 PowerPoint. However we are looking at Google Slides today.

To get the Pear Deck Extension for Google Slides, you will have to click Add Ons which is located in the center of your screen top center of your screen you will see Add ons.

Then you click on the drop box get Add Ons.

Next you will see a popup window on the Pear Deck page in Google Suite Marketplace. Click Install.

Then Pear Deck will ask or prompt you for access to your Google account.

When you see Pear Deck for Google Slides needs your permission in order to start installing. Click Allow.

Then select the account you want to use with Pear Deck.

So here you will see another pop up window in the giving you the opportunity to choose your email account.

Then you have installed the Pear Deck add on.

You can go back and open it at any time from the same add on menu, as you will see you click on Add on.

Then you click Open. So now that you have opened and or added the Pear Deck extension.

Now that you have added the Pear Deck extension, let's get to work on creating your Pear Deck presentation. Let's get to work. Click on Add on.

Then on the Dropbox click on Pear Deck. For Google Slides Add on there is an arrow that says Open Pear Deck Add on a Sidebar on the right hand corner of your screen will appear.

Then you will see a number of ways you can add information on your slide. For today's tutorial we will be looking at incorporating Premade Slides.

Click our Template library. Within our Template library you are going to see Lesson Builders Premade Slides that you can incorporate in your lesson for various areas and categories of information.

For today's presentation we will be looking at four types of interactive. Right!

So let's begin with "Beginning of lesson". Click on that then you look for Text slide I am going to click on what did you learn from the homework?

This is an open-ended response slide and I will show you shortly how this slide operates with your students where they are able to give their live feedback.

So as you can see there are many more types of slides.

Let's click a draggable slide. , "How was the homework assessment?"

You scroll down to the bottom, "How was the homework assessment?" Draggable slide.

Click that slide and it will appear as a slide to be used in your presentation.

Let us now scroll down until we see end of lesson and we continue scrolling down until you see the third option.

Circle how you are feeling drawing slide so this gives the student an opportunity to use their psychomotor skills.

So as you can see again there are many options for teachers to incorporate in their lesson.

Click back during the lesson and you will see once again many pre-made slides allowing you to click and customize scroll down to the very end until you see, 'Do you feel comfortable sharing your thoughts out loud right now? multiple choice slide.' Great! So we have included four types of interactive slides.

Let's test them out! So you click on the first slide.

Then you click on the green button on the left hand corner of your screen.

On the Pear Deck Sidebar, click Start lesson. I hope you have your phone handy or you can ask a friend to join you with their phone or laptop.

Click Instructor Paced as this is a live demonstration and class. Now you will receive a different code.

Your students will be informed to click Joinpd.com when the prompt asks you to sign up for here.

That's for a premium version of Pear Deck You click, "no thanks." Joinpd.com so you will see a pop-up window and it says that, "We are waiting for students." You will have a different code for your class.

Allow the students to enter and then you click, "Start class." "What did you learn from the homework?"

Allow your students to answer the question.

Then you click, "Show response", so you can see that someone has responded in my class and they showed what did they learn from the homework? They learned about Pear Deck.

Let's look at the next interactive slide. This allows the students to manipulate the icons by dragging them across the screen.

Let's see how our students thought. What were the thoughts of our students concerning their homework assignment?

So they are moving it around. Let's see where they center the icon. Thumbs up! You seem to have understood the homework assignment.

Click Hide response to move to the next slide. Circle how you are feeling. Let's see how our students are feeling today. They are able to circle.

There you go! They are happy!

Then the instructor clicks on the next slide. This is a multiple choice question. Let's see the responses.

Absolutely, Please call on me!

Alright. So to end this presentation, you hover onto the right hand corner of your screen.

The bottom right hand corner of your screen. You click "End." You can name your lesson.

So I am actually going to give it a name which is today's date.

Save and end session and that's it. Instructors this is a short tutorial on how to use Pear Deck to promote student engagement in your classroom.
